## Pray Your Part: General Election 2024



The bishops of the Church of England have issued a call to put prayer and participation at the heart of the General Election campaign as the UK prepares to go to the polls.

Archbishops Justin Welby and Stephen Cottrell urge people to set aside time amid the heat of the current campaign to reflect and pray for our nation and our world.

They also issue a plea to everyone to put 'good grace and a commitment to truth and integrity' at the heart of the campaign.

The Church of England is launching a campaign known as **#PrayYourPart** – to promote prayer and participation in the life of our nation and communities, both as voters and as citizens. A series of daily thematic reflections drawn from the Bible and exploring major themes will be published this week, covering the final three weeks up to polling day. They will be available as a booklet, in audio form for smart speakers, as free opt-in emails and through social media.
