Prayer Spaces in Schools

at St Peter's CE Primary School!



Church members volunteer regularly in many of Harrogate's schools, delivering Collective Worship, supporting phonics, serving as governors and chairs of governors and encouraging initiatives like Transforming Lives for Good (www.tlg.org.uk - bringing hope and a future to struggling children).

A team from St Peter's is adding to this good work by running the first *official Prayer Spaces in Schools* (PSiS) Week. A PSiS leader, Sue Kirby, has recently moved to Harrogate and is working with us. We will transform a space at St Peter's CE School from $10^{th} - 14^{th}$ March. It will feel magical. Each day, groups will enter the space to try all kinds of practical reflections in the form of multi-sensory, tactile prayer stations. The feedback from previous groups is extremely positive as children are given time and space to reflect and just 'be'. It has influenced prayer for many (not just children) so if you are interested in creative prayer, or find prayer challenging, do check out their site!



The renewal of the Church Electoral Roll 2025

Every six years a new Church Electoral Roll is prepared from scratch, so everyone (even if you've been on the roll before) needs to complete a new application form. The eligibility criteria are as follows:

- 1. Anyone who has worshipped at St Peter's at least once a month for the past 6 months, is baptised, and over 16 years of age.
- 2. Anyone who is a resident in the Parish (and over 16) whether they attend worship or not.

Application forms are available on the Welcome Desk or can be downloaded from our <u>website</u>. They should be returned to the box on the Welcome Desk or handed to Carole Raw, Electoral Roll Officer, by 22nd April 2025.
