Today we welcome **Peter Wright** from Pateley Bridge, a volunteer speaker and teacher for **Christian Aid**, to our services this morning.

In Kenya, extreme weather is making it harder and harder to survive. For communities fighting the climate crisis, every last drop matters and every last one of us can help them thrive. The coronavirus pandemic has only increased the urgent need for families to access a reliable source of water.

The devastating climate crisis robs people of the water and food they need to live.

Rose walks for six hours to fetch water for her grandchildren. She tries hard to give them the kind of life she remembers from when she was a girl: when the rivers flowed with water and the crops bore fruit. Rose and her grandchildren shouldn't have to go hungry. A simple earth dam, built with the help of Christian Aid's partners and your donations, could completely change her life. This Christian Aid Week, you can be one of the hundreds of thousands of our supporters who give, act and pray to stop this climate crisis driving people like Rose to hunger.


From envelope collections to walking 300,000 steps in May, Christian Aid Week brings people together as one community against global poverty and injustice.

Thy Kingdom Come 2021 starts this week!

Thy Kingdom Come 2021 (TKC21) runs from Thursday 13th May to Sunday 23rd May (Ascension Day to Pentecost). In light of the impact of COVID-19, the **2021 special focus** is to **pray for five people** to come to know the love of Christ from within two groups of people, reflected in the parables of the Lost Sheep and the Lost Coin in Luke chapter 15:

1. The Lost Sheep – those who are far off but have seen something or someone come near. During the last year, this means those who have tasted what Church is like for the first time (or the first time in a very long time), such as attending an online service, receiving a food parcel, or have asked for prayers and so on. Let's pray they come to know the love of God through Jesus Christ.
2. The Lost Coin – those who are near, who are already in Church, but have drifted away during COVID-19 for one reason or another. Let's pray for them to come to know again the love of God through Jesus Christ.


A selection of new resources for 2021 has been produced, catering for people of all ages. These include:



St Peter's Ladies who Lunch are getting together again!

Raising awareness of dying, death and bereavement



Where people die is changing. More and more people have been dying at home in recent years. And the pandemic has seen this number leap by tens of thousands. We have very little evidence about the quality of these deaths, and whether the right care and support was in place. The quality of care for some people at the end of their life is still not good enough.

There is no right or wrong place to die; it will be different for everyone. But it is important for families to think about it, to talk about it and to plan for it. We want people of all ages to be in a good place when they die – physically, emotionally and with the right care in place. Getting there means having some important conversations and taking some careful decisions. Make sure that you and your loved ones are in a good place to die - visit the [Dying Matters](http://www.dyingmatters.org) website (www.dyingmatters.org) to find resources and support.

From Lament to Action

The Diocese of Leeds has welcomed the Archbishops' Anti-Racism Taskforce report *From Lament to Action* which proposes urgent cultural changes in the life of the Church of England.




It issues a warning to the Archbishops of Canterbury and York that a failure to act could be a 'last straw' for many people of UK Minority Ethnic (UKME) or Global Majority Heritage (GMH) backgrounds with 'devastating effects' on the future of the Church. The report is clear that addressing the underlying issues of systemic racism is a 'missional imperative' for the Church.

"Disregarding a significant part of the population, and thus denying the gifts they bring for the service of the Church, must not continue," the taskforce warns.
