John Wood, Wellspring Trustee

Today we welcome John Wood, a trustee at Wellspring Therapy& Training, to St Peter's. Wellspring Therapy and Training is a charity based in Starbeck, Harrogate, providing affordable, psychological support to children and adults in distress, and promoting good mental health through education and training. We are a Christian charity, motivated by our belief that every person matters and is loved by God. There is the option of a spiritual element to counselling for those who want it, but we provide our services to all, regardless of background, and to people of any faith or none.

During the Covid pandemic, record numbers of children and adults sought NHS help for problems such as anxiety, depression and eating disorders. With so much pressure placed upon the NHS, charities like Wellspring are a vital resource. Last year, over 40% of referrals to Wellspring's counselling services came from NHS teams and local authorities.

Since Wellspring was founded nearly 20 years ago, the charity has grown in response to the increasing demand for mental health support. Currently, our team of counsellors see approximately 110 clients each week. The service we provide would cost clients a minimum of £40 - £50 per session from a private counsellor, but we only ask clients to contribute what they can towards their sessions. Many can only pay a small amount, for example last year, 34% of affordable counselling clients could only pay £5 per session. The support of generous individuals, businesses, churches, and funding organisations helps to bridge this gap for our clients. 

'Wilfrid and Benedict Biscop: revisiting their Gallic connections'

Thursday 13th October, 7:30 – 9:30 pm

The final lecture returns to England and explores Wilfrid's relationship with fellow-Northumbrian Benedict Biscop, who founded the monasteries of Monkwearmouth and Jarrow. Ian Wood, Emeritus Professor at the University of Leeds. focuses international nature of their world through his examination of their connections in Gaul. 
